

**Dr. Don Maisch**, PhD has been involved in the issue of the health impacts of electromagnetic fields (EMF) since the early 1990's when he was a science writer for Australian Senator Robert Bell. He has served on government and industry EMF standard setting committees on behalf of the Consumers Federation of Australia. In 2010, he was awarded a PhD from the University of Wollongong for his thesis "The Procrustean Approach" which examines the historical development of the Western radiofrequency/ microwave (RF/MW) exposure standards. His thesis argues that a military-industrial complex has long controlled human exposure standards at the expense of objective scientific inquiry and public health protection. This work was recently followed up with a book chapter "Spin In The Antipodes: A history of industry involvement in telecommunications health research in Australia" (2017). Dr. Maisch has a special interest in promoting research examining possible health impacts from the introduction of new wireless technology, such as the Internet of Things (IoT), 5G and the smart electricity grid.
