Dr. Murray May, BSc (Hons), Dip Ed, M Ed, PhD worked for over 20 years in the Australian Public Service in Canberra on environmental and health policy issues, from both national and local perspectives. From 2008 to 2016 he was Visiting Fellow in Geography at UNSW Canberra. He has been involved in environmental health issues since the early 1970s, initially with people such as Judith Wright on the National Estate Committee of Inquiry. Later involvements include links with Professor Stephen Boyden's pioneering work on human ecology and the need for a biosensitive society, namely a society that promotes health and wellbeing in all sections of the human population and in the ecosystems of the biosphere. The role of EMFs as an issue for human health and also plants and animal life is pertinent in this regard. Dr. May's later career PhD was completed in 2004 in the transdisciplinary social ecology program at the University of Western Sydney (now Western Sydney University). He is also a regular contributor on social and environmental issues to *The* Canberra Times.
